Please join us in the Chapel following the service for a **12:00pm Light Lunch** and **12:30pm-2:00pm Workshop** with our guest preacher this Sunday, CB Beal, M.Div.

In this workshop, we will briefly explore the ideas of "preemptive radical inclusion" as a practice to increase justice, we will practice skills and bear witness to one another. CB will hold space within which we explore who we are, both broadly and individually, to continue growth as beloved community, a community of justice, equity, and love.

Brown who was killed in 1993, at age 15, by gun violence, the Institute's mission is to be a center of healing, teaching, and learning for families and communities impacted by murder, trauma, grief, and loss. Their principles are those that many of us strive for and believe in: Love, Unity, Faith, Hope, Courage, Justice, and Forgiveness.

In addition to being the Shared Offering recipient for April, the Institute will again sponsor the **Mother's Day Walk for Peace**, and we're hoping many from our congregation will participate.

## **Get involved!**

Do you want to meet more people at First Parish?

A great way to meet people and get involved at First Parish is to **join The Welcome Team Ministry**. Members commit once a month to usher or greet for the hour before church and assist with the collection and other small tasks during the service. Serving on the team allows you to help create a welcoming atmosphere for newcomers. It is a wonderful way to connect with members as well as newcomers. ## **Accompaniment Volunteering**

First Parish is a member of the CISC, a coalition of 10 Cambridge-area congregations that is currently hosting a woman and her two children in sanctuary so she can avoid deportation and separation from her family. "Accompaniment" volunteers are needed seven

days a week on-site at a church in Harvard Square. Sometimes volunteer shifts are quiet, and sometimes there is a lot of interaction with the children. We can pair you with an experienced volunteer so you won't be on your own. Volunteering helps in her long process of fighting to stay in the U.S.

### **Child Care Volunteering**

The CISC childcare team is looking for several new volunteers who can commit to regular monthly outings to ensure that the children (ages 2 and almost 4) are able to spend time outside each day. A simple hour or two of outdoor play means so much in the life of this family we've committed as a coalition to support. Because coverage and consistency are ongoing concerns, we are looking for people who can commit to at least 2 weekday morning or afternoon outings a month.
