## **Staffing Changes at First Parish**

As discussed at the June semi-annual meeting, the Personnel Committee has worked with staff and committees to examine our current staffing and analyze what First Parish needs moving forward. With the Standing Committee's approval several staff changes have been authorized and implemented.

We have created a new staff position of Communications and Membership Coordinator to enhance our existing print, website and social media presence; to support community building and visitor/member engagement; and overall administrative staff services. The Communications and Membership Coordinator position was created through the combination of two part-time positions to allow for a full-time staff team member. We are pleased to report that we have selected Emily Guthrie, a recent graduate of Denison University with a degree in Religion and Communication to fill this position. Emily, a life-long Unitarian Universalist with a strong commitment to social justice issues began work on September 10.

We welcome **Colleen Vickers**, **Religious Education Intern**, into our community. She will be with us until the New Year and works Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Sundays.

We are also pleased to report that **Roland Ellies** has accepted a new role as **Building Manager**, effective October 1, to enhance building services for our congregational needs and facilitate services for tenants.

With Roland's new responsibilities, we will also be hiring part-time custodians to focus on cleaning. Roland will supervise the custodians and also take more responsibility for security. His hours will shift to noon-8:00 pm on Tuesday-Friday and 8:00 am-4:00 pm on Sundays. His responsibilities will include staffing the office 6:30-7:30 Tuesday-Friday to make it easier for people to enter the building for meetings and events in the early evening. This shift will happen the first week of October.

Interviews are underway and we hope to announce the names of people to fill our **custodian**, **Homelessness**Ministry Coordinator and Youth Coordinator positions by next week.
